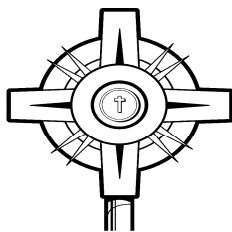

POPE'S PRAYER INTENTIONS FOR JUNE

The Holy Father's prayer intentions for June are that institutions around the globe will work to guarantee respect for the human person in all stages of life.

Pope Benedict's *general prayer intention* is: "That every national and trans-national institution may strive to guarantee respect for human life from conception to natural death."

Pope Benedict's *mission intention* is: "That the Churches in Asia, which constitute a "little flock" among non-Christian populations, may know how to communicate the Gospel and give joyful witness to their adherence to Christ".

TAKING CHILDREN TO MASS

According to Canon Law, by age seven, children should be attending Mass every Sunday. Here are some simple strategies for making Mass more pleasant with children:

- *Decide ahead what Mass to attend.*
- *Set out everyone's clothes so getting ready is not a hassle.*
- *Bring along a picture book about the Mass.*
- *Make sure everyone has something to put into the collection basket.*
- *Sit in front so children can see.*
- *Bring children into the communion line, even if they are too young to receive.*
- *Praise children for good behavior.*
- *Celebrate good behavior by doing something special after Mass.*
